### a) Admin Updates

- Grateful for the support for connection week it was an amazing way to bring the students together brought a lot of the students together brought the teachers together it was such a smooth event people were surprised it was the first one maybe next year we can do one at the start and end of the year
- A man called about his concern about garbage in the area on the way to Circle K – requesting that parents call and ask for garbage cans from the City of Calgary
- Peace officers came on April 14<sup>th</sup> they were doing enforcement on traffic in the area
- We are hatching chicks and leadership students will create education pieces for the learners
- Options for next year we are in the initial stages we did a survey of all the students + teachers and cross-referenced the results – now reviewing access to options
  - Grade 5/6 these are standard
  - Grade 7 art, band x2, photography, film studies, design studies (based on children's interest for example, one group of students

- designed games), fashion studies plus the same things from before
- Grade 8 now adding Cosmetology. Design studies, Tourism plus the same things from last year
- Grade 9 adding Design Studies, French as a second language
- There are at least 3 new options per grade
- They are still looking at additional process updates and planning for next year at the next Council meeting

- Lots of cognitive benefits: communication, problem-solving,

   increased academic achievement and more
- This draws a very different crowd (80% of participants in e-sports say this is their first extra-curricular activity)
- There are now some e-sport scholarships at Universities/Colleges
- We would like a soft start:

Games: \$235.55 x 2Cases \$50 - \$100 x 2

- So roughly \$2000 to start up then relatively low year over year
- Ms Jenna Hunt FitSet was set up at the other school today and the kids were excited – it is booked for May 20 – 22. Alien Inline is booked for Feb 5/6.
  - For the equipment list they have 26 items and are trying to prioritize it
  - A father is a teacher at FEO and has volunteered to make a Gagaball Pit for our school
  - Jenna is looking at more field trips but if only 50% of kids return their forms – this leads to very expensive bussing
